Garbage

Garbage will be picked up every TUESDAY except when it falls on: Canadian Statutory Holidays

- Garbage carts to be curbside by 7:00 a.m.
- If the Contractor cannot pick up the garbage on a designated garbage day, please bring your garbage in from the curb; it will be picked up the following Tuesday.
- Appliances, furniture or anything not inside the bins, will not be picked up. Tenants will be responsible for disposing of these items. Any items left curbside will be collected by Southport and the charges invoiced back to the Tenant.

Compost

Compost will be picked up every TUESDAY (May-October) except when it falls on a Canadian Statutory Holiday.

- Compost carts to be curbside by 7:00 a.m.
- November 1st—April 31st Compost service will be monthly on the last Tuesday of each month,

Note

- Tenant's that may require "Cart Assist" are asked to contact our office for more details.
- One recycle bin, one garbage cart and one compost cart will be provided to each tenant at move in and are to be returned at move out.
- Replacement cost of damaged or missing carts is \$125.00 each.
